Large pediatrics group uses Phreesia to address patients' unmet social needs

Raleigh Pediatrics, a two-location practice that serves more than 22,000 patients, is committed to providing compassionate, high-quality care, including to those who are vulnerable and have unmet social needs. Approximately 15% of the organization's patients and their families receive Medicaid assistance. So when the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services announced Healthy Opportunities, an Initiative to address the area's non-medical drivers of health, Raleigh Pediatrics joined the statewide effort.

The organization uses Phreesia to automatically deliver North Carolina's standardized health-screening tool during intake to ask patients and their families about social drivers of health, such as food insecurity and affordable housing. Raleigh Pediatrics also employs a care coordinator who monitors patient and family responses and provides follow-up support for those in need.

After just one day of screenings, the care coordinator identified three mothers who were struggling to afford baby formula. The care coordinator says she often sees mothers who have trouble breastfeeding and decide to feed their babies with formula. However, when they realize the cost of formula, they start buying less food for themselves, which further hinders their ability to breastfeed. Phreesia's intake solution allows Raleigh Pediatrics to continue to identify those mothers who need help purchasing formula so they no longer have to choose between adequately feeding their babies or feeding themselves.

Prior to using Phreesia's Social
Determinants of Health screening tool,
we had no way of knowing if patients
were struggling to pay for food unless
they shared that with us voluntarily.
Now, we use Phreesia to screen patients
for these needs during online mobile
check-in, which offers them a greater
level of privacy to answer sensitive
questions, and is a critical reason why
the screenings have been so effective."
